
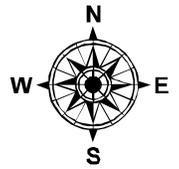

Deer Isle / Stonington






<b>Length of Boom</b>	1900	feet <i>Unless otherwise indicated, the boom length given is straight line distance as measured on the map. Actual length required will vary with conditions, and increase with current.</i>	
<b>Strategy Implementation</b>	Deploy 700' of boom across Burnt Cove and 1200 feet of boom across Crockett Cove. Possible natural collection area at sand beach in Goose Cove (Goose Cove Lodge)		
<b>Site Access</b>	Rte. 1 to Rte. 15 to Stonington boat launch. Goose Cove: From Deer Isle village, right on Maine St. and 3 miles to Goose Cove Road.		
<b>Staging Areas</b>	Stonington boat launch		
<b>Collection Points</b>	Sand beach at Goose Cove Lodge is possible natural collection area.		
<b>Environmental Concerns</b>	Crockett Cove: Tidal flats, shellfish beds, marine worm habitat, shorebird area and eelgrass. Burnt Cove: shellfish beds, eelgrass, shorebird area, lobster dealer.
