<i>Length of Boom</i>	4100	feet <i>Unless otherwise indicated, the boom length given is straight line distance as measured on the map. Actual length required will vary with conditions, and increase with current.</i>	
<i>Strategy Implementation</i>	<p>Priorities are Pretty Marsh Harbor, Squid Cove and Mill Cove. Deploy 900 feet of harbor boom inside Pretty Marsh Harbor to protect marsh. Current is too strong under stone culvert at road to boom there. Use 1100 feet of harbor boom to exclude from Mill Cove, and two 750 foot sections to close off Squid Cove and Goose Marsh Pond. If available, use three 500 foot sections of harbor boom to deflect oil from Bartlett Island from Birch Cove to Great Cove.</p>
