

## MAINE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION PUBLIC NOTICE OF INTENT TO FILE AN APPLICATION

**DIVISION OF MATERIALS MANAGEMENT** 

PUBLIC NOTICE REQUIREMENTS DIFFER DEPENDING ON THE LICENSE TYPE. REVIEW THE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY TO ENSURE YOU UNDERSTAND THE REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUR PERMIT

FOR PERMIT-BY-RULE APPLICATIONS (within 30 days prior to submitting the PBR notification to the Maine DEP):

• Mail the application and a completed Public Notice of Intent to File (see Page 2) to the municipal office of the municipality in which the project is proposed (or the appropriate Office of the County Commissioners and Maine Land Use Planning Commission).

**FOR AGRONOMIC UTILIZATION PROGRAM APPLICATIONS** (within 30 days prior to submitting the application to the Maine DEP):

- Mail the application and a completed Public Notice of Intent to File (see Page 2) to the municipal office of
  the municipality in which the applicant is located (or the appropriate Office of the County Commissioners
  and Maine Land Use Planning Commission).
- Publish the Public Notice once in a newspaper of general circulation in the area where the applicant is located and in a newspaper in general circulation in Augusta, Maine.

## **ALL OTHER APPLICATIONS** (within 30 days prior to submitting the application to the Maine DEP):

- Mail the application and a completed Public Notice of Intent to File (see Page 2) to the municipal office of
  the municipality in which the project is proposed (or the appropriate Office of the County Commissioners
  and Maine Land Use Planning Commission).
- Mail the completed Public Notice to abutters<sup>1</sup> and all persons/entities owning land within 1,000 feet of the proposed project (*Upon request by a prospective applicant, the Department may grant an exception to the requirement that an applicant provide notice to an abutter if the abutter is one mile or more from the proposed project and the exception would not conflict with notice requirements of other applicable rules.*)
- Publish the Public Notice once in a newspaper of general circulation in the vicinity of, or as close as possible to, the area where the proposed project will be located.

## **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

If a public hearing is requested, the Department will hold a hearing if the Department determines there is credible conflicting technical information regarding licensing criterion, and it is likely that a hearing will assist the Department in understanding the evidence. Within five days after the Department's decision whether to hold a public hearing, the Department will provide notice of the decision to the person who requested the hearing, the applicant, and other affected person/interested party.

The Department Commissioner or the Board of Environmental Protection may schedule and hold a public informational meeting in accordance with 38 M.R.S. § 345-A (5) to collect comments that will become part of the record. Any such meeting will be held during the period when written public comments may be submitted to the Department.

1. "Abutter" means a person/entity owning property contiguous with the property on which the project is proposed.

Any person, including the applicant, may request a hearing on the application. The request must be received by the Department, in writing, no later than 20 days after the Department has accepted the application as complete for processing (for a Permit-by-Rule application, any comments only must be submitted within 10 days after application is submitted to the Department). The request must indicate the interest of the person filing the request and specify the reasons why a hearing is warranted.
The Department will hold a hearing in those instances where the Department determines there is credible conflicting technical information regarding a licensing criterion, and it is likely that a hearing will assist the Department in understanding the evidence. Within five days after the Department's decision whether to hold a hearing, the Department will provide notice of the decision to the person who requested a hearing, the applicant, and any other affected person/interested party.
