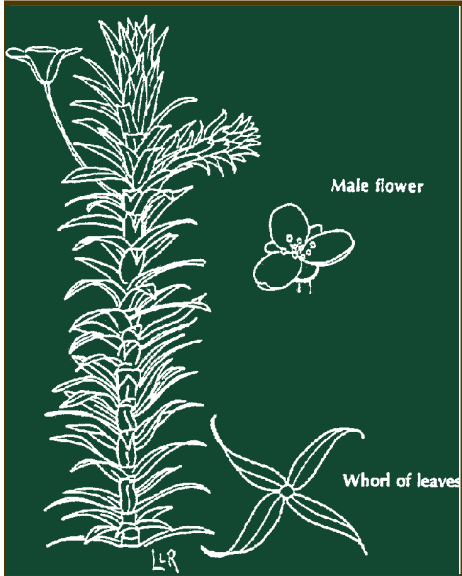
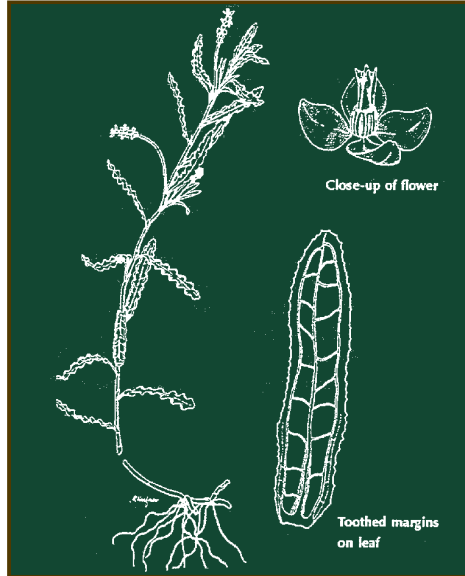


# MAINE'S ELEVEN MOST UNWANTED

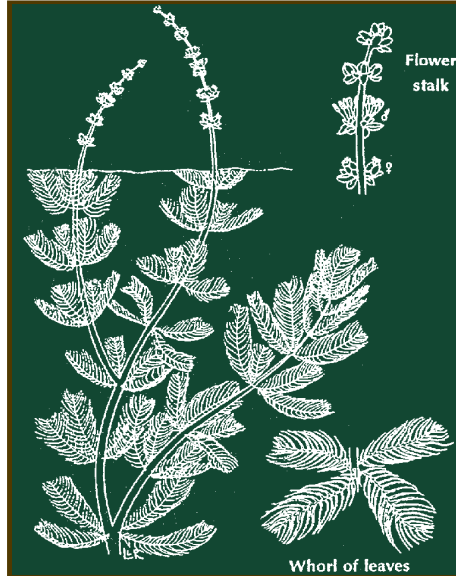

(*Egeria densa*)<sup>1</sup>



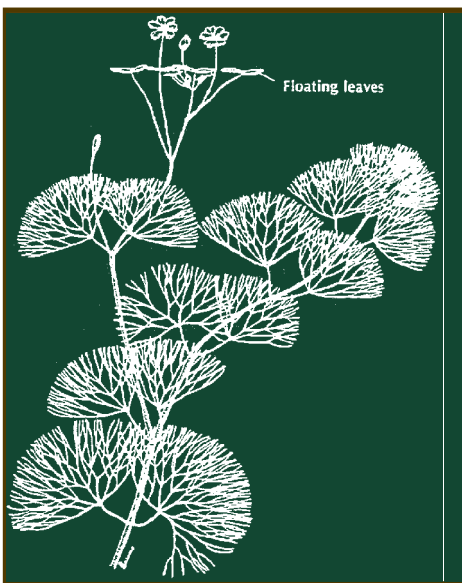
**Curly-leaf pondweed**

(*Myriophyllum spicatum*)<sup>1</sup>



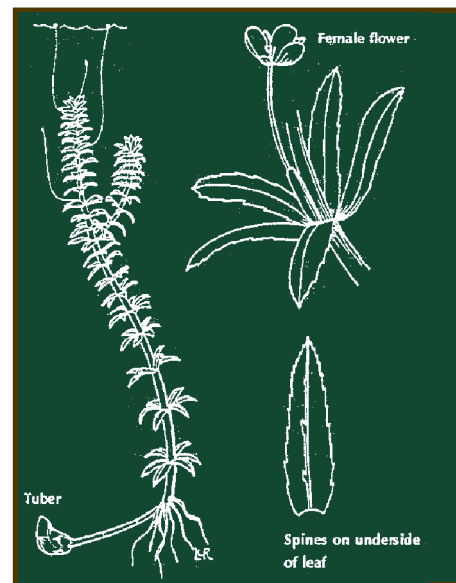
**European naiad**  
(*Najas minor*)<sup>2</sup>



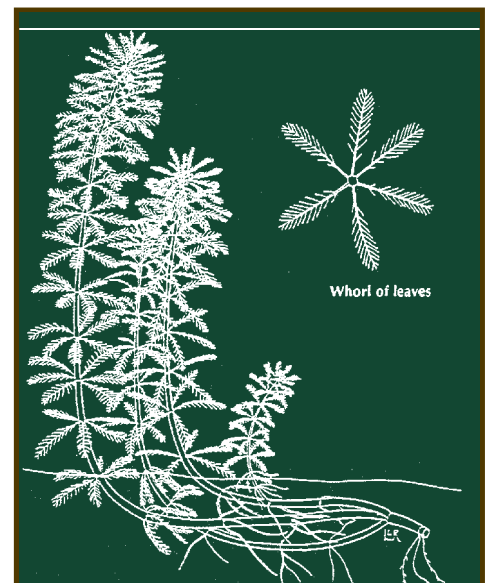
**Fanwort**  
(*Cabomba caroliniana*)<sup>3</sup>



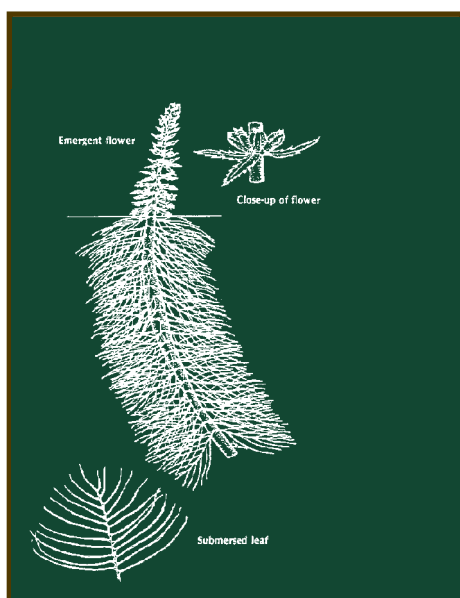
**Frogbit**

(*Hydrilla verticillata*)<sup>1</sup>



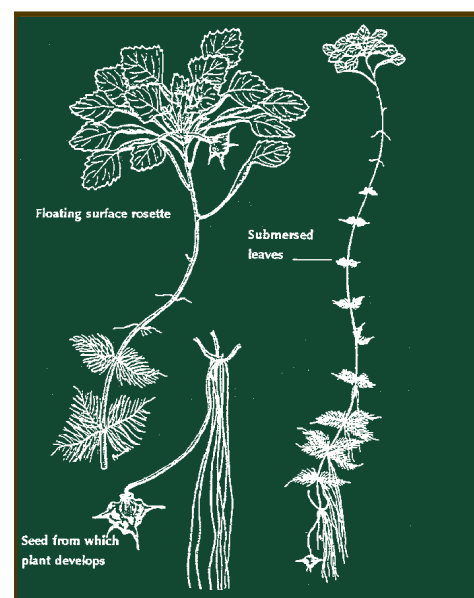
**Parrot feather**
