- a. Address of concerns about system operators running systems Mary Bowers
 - i. Use of licensure to fulfill system requirements using another's license number, "paper operator", and contract operator oversees system but may not be on-site.
 - 1. Possible ethical concerns
 - 2. Failure to monitor violations
 - 3. Compliance issues
 - ii. Issue discussion
 - 1. Review guidance document at next meeting
 - 2. Extend invitation to other contract operators to meeting for discussion
- b. Review options for a Bangor and/or Machias ABC test site in lieu of PSI Jim Jacobsen
 - i. Re-cap: January 2019, Holden testing site was closed without notice, PSI is contracted by ABC to find testing sites for proctored exams
 - ii. Tom Healy, of ABC, reports PSI has not produced alternatives for our testing needs.
 - 1. No updates for this meeting
 - 2. It is important to accommodate new licensees across the state
 - 3. Will travel to proctor tests if necessary
 - iii. Brian Tarbuck and Jim Jacobsen; will write a letter to PSI
 - 1. addressing PSI's lack of proficiency in finding new testing sites and possible contract termination
- c. Review of <u>Section 5 subsection (E) (4)</u> of the licensing rule per request Jim Jacobsen
 - i. Request received from Mickey Hall of Maine Water Company for employee to present case to the Board
 - 1. Worked for MWC 30 years, recently passed class 1 Distribution exam, but does not meet minimum education requirements of high school diploma or GED.
 - ii. Issue: Cannot approve license under current rules of BLWSO.
 - 1. Education can be substituted for experience, but experience cannot be substituted for education.
 - iii. Discussion of Issue:
 - 1. Education requirement comes from EPA Guidelines
 - 2. Rule says can substitute education for experience but does not say you cannot substitute the experience for education
 - 3. May have to write general criteria for the substitution of experience for education

MOTION: Move to grant licensure based on extensive experience and documented training as a water operator.

- d. Consider adopting Conflict of Interest document language for Board Brian Tarbuck
 - i. Conflict of interest is used in a Regulatory Board
 - In a BLWSO policy document from 7-28-17, states that the BLWSO is an Occupational and Professional Licensing Board, and on the list in 5 MRSA Chapter
 - iii. Not listed on the Governor's list of boards for occupational and professional licensing and do not need to have the Conflict of Interest document
 - iv. Board to review for next meeting
 - v. Brian will contact everyone when Tara has more information
- e. Water Operator Licensing Survey Jim Jacobsen
 - i. Received approval from the Office of Information Technology to conduct a survey through SurveyMonkey
 - 1. Give water operators a feeling of more investment and participation
 - 2. 3 question survey, and comments
 - 3. 4 /101; 4 rated it difficult/very difficult, comments: submitting TCH documents online
 - 4. There were intermittent problems with the online renewal site, InforME
 - 5. Potential tool for the Board to receive input from the water operators
