Maine's estimated population for July 1, 2001 was 1,286,670.

$\Rightarrow$ The population of Maine increased by about 33,500 residents over the past 5 years, a $2 \underline{1} 2 \%$ increase (nationally there was a $6 \%$ increase in population). York county experienced an $81 / 2 \%$ increase of nearly 15,000 people, the largest increase of any county (both numerically and proportionally). Three Maine counties experienced a decrease in population - Aroostook (a 4\% decrease), Piscataquis (a 4\% decrease), and Washington (a $\mathbf{2} 1 ⁄ 2 \%$ decrease).
$\Rightarrow$ The overall trend towards an older Maine population continued into the 2000s. The 5-14 year old age group was the only age group younger than 35 years old to experience an increase in numbers (a $2 \%$ increase); however, all age groups 35 years old or older increased in numbers.
Nationally, the trend towards an older population also continued into the 2000s; however, nationally there were increased numbers in both younger and older age groups. In fact, there were increases in all age groups except the 65-74 year old age group.
