
1996-2002. Approximately 2.8% of these births (2,661) were to minors. **Percent of Births to Unwed Minors**


→ Only about 5% of infants born to minors were to married women. Unwed minors accounted for 2.530 births. The father's age was known for 62% (1,556) of these 2,530 births. Of these 1,556 births, 82.2% (1,279) had fathers aged 18 or older and 31% (476) had fathers aged 21 or older.


The majority of births to minors occurred to 17 year olds (58%) and 16 year olds (29%). The remaining 13% were to minors aged 13 to 15 years old.

→ When births to Maine residents were broken down by county. Somerset County had the high-



est percentage of minor births (4.1%), followed by Piscataquis (4.0%), Washington (3.9%), Androscoggin (3.6%), and Oxford (3.5%) Counties. Cumberland County had the lowest percentage of minor births, 1.8%.

→ Mothers under 18 years old were 2 1/2 times more likely to report their pregnancy as unintended (83%) than were mothers aged 18 - 45 (33%).1
