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
MAINE

→ Of the 739 hygienists working in Maine, 90% of the actively practicing hygienists are employed in a private dental office.

REGISTERED DENTAL HYGIENISTS Practice, Education and Benefits: 2004

- → Twenty percent (145) have utilized Public Health Supervision Status, which allows registered hygienists to practice in a non-traditional settina.
- → Scaling, radiographs, oral assessments, and oral instruction are provided by nearly all hygienists. More than 75% also provide sealants and periodontic therapy. Only 25% report administering anesthesia as a patient care service.

- → If the scope of practice for dental hygienists were changed to include expanded functions such as placement of fillings, 568 (77%) report that they would be
 - interested in adding expanded functions to their practice.
- → Sixty-six percent (424) of hygienists report earning an hourly rate of \$24.00 or more per hour. Of these, 71 report that their hourly rate of pay exceeds \$30.00 per hour.
- → Over 80% of the hygienists report that they get paid vacation, free or reduced dental care for themselves and continuing education benefits.

- → Eighty one percent of active hygienists (600) received their education in Maine schools. Another 86 received their degrees from the remaining New England states.
- → Most of the active hygienists (684) report having an associate's degree in dental hygiene. While 150 report multiple degrees, 543 indicate they have a solo dental hygiene associate's degree, 21 a solo dental hygiene bachelor's degree and 8 a dental hygiene certificate.
