
- **Health Status Indicators**
- Population: In 1992, the population of York county was 166,602, making it Maine's 2nd most populous county.
- ► Population Aged 65 and Older: In 1992, 21,753 county residents were 65 years old or older, about 13% of the county population. The state average was 14%; nationally it was 12.7%.

- Births: There were 2.399 births to residents of York county: this yielded a county birth rate of 14.4 births for every 1,000 residents.
- Adolescent births (10-17 years old): 3.1% of all live births in this county were to adolescent mothers; this was significantly less than the national figure of 3.8%.
- Low birth weight babies: In York county, 5.2% of all live births resulted in babies weighing less than 2500 grams (5 1/2 pounds). This was significantly less than the national figure of 5.8%.
- Deaths: There were 1,270 deaths to county residents in 1992. The age-adjusted death rate*, 4.6, compares to the national rate of 4.9.

- Age-adjusted Death Rate: The age-adjusted death rate due to motor vehicle accidents was significantly less than the national rate.
- ► Infant Deaths**: The county infant death rate, 4.2 deaths per 1,000 live births, was significantly less than the national rate of 7.3 deaths.

- 1991 age-adjusted death rates are for underlying cause of death, U.S. rates are for whites only; rates are age adjusted to the US 1940 standard population; these are rates that have been standardized to eliminate differences due solely to variations in the age composition of the populations.
- **Infant deaths were calculated using the average of the infant death rate for the three year period, 1990-1992.
