



the population in 1998 than they did in 1970. This was comparable to what was observed nationally.

- Although females made up nearly 60% of the population aged 65 years old and older, they represented 72% of the population 85 and older.
- ▶ In 1998, 80 % of Maine deaths were 1985 1990 to residents aged 65 years old and Year older - 9,715 elderly Maine residents died. The leading cause of death for this age group was heart disease followed by cancer. In fact, deaths from these 2 causes represented more than half of all elderly deaths.



▶ When asked, "How is your general health?", 75% of Maine's elderly residents reported that their health was excellent, very good, or good; 87.5% of Maine's total adult population reported the same answers.¹
