



➡ The 2000 U.S. Census population count ranked Maine's population size as 40th in the country with a population of 1,274,923. 1

POPULATION: MAINE, 2000 July 1, 2000



Maine's population has increased by 4% - 47,000 people - since the 1990 census count (only 4 other states showed a smaller increase in population than Maine). Although there was a net gain in Maine's population, 5 counties – Androscoggin, Aroostook, Penobscot, Piscataquis, and Washington – showed population decreases over the decade.



- ➡ Four of Maine's 5 largest cities lost population between the 1990 census and the 2000 census (Portland, Lewiston, Bangor, and Auburn). Maine's 4th largest city, South Portland, had a small gain (less than 200 people). Of Maine's 10 largest cities, Augusta had the greatest population loss proportionally (13%), and Scarborough the greatest gain (35%).
- Maine had the least racially diverse population of any state in the U.S. in 2000 with 97% of the population reporting their race as "white"; nationally, 75% of the nation's population reported their race as "white".
