Downeast Deeper Dive Maine Integrated Youth Health Survey, Korey Pow Hagerty, MPH, Maine CDC Presentation link <u>MIYHS Website Link</u> Korey.Pow@maine.gov

Survey given to grades 5-12, responses voluntary and anonymous. Examines Mental Health, Substance Use, Unintentional injuries and violence, Nutrition and physical activity, and supports.

Typically administered every other year. Voluntary for schools and for students, and parents can opt their child out. Though in Maine, normally ~ 70-80% of schools participate.

Data analyzed at State, PHD, and County levels.

2021 data

Hancock County did not have enough data to create a high school or middle school report. Washington County did not get a middle school report because of lack of data. No Downeast Middle school report.

Generally, Downeast is on par with Maine.

- In Maine, twice as many HS girls are experiencing mental health issues compared to boys. This number is increasing.
- 1 in 4 Maine students report 4 or more ACEs

2023 Date still being collected, through first week of April

Washington County, 88% of HSs signed up, only 2% of MSs and likely won't yield county report Hancock County, 57% of HSs, and 55% MSs have signed up likely not enough to yield county reports

Legislature still accepting testimony virtually and in person. This makes it more accessible.

MPHSA starts setting yearly priorities around June. Consults with partners throughout the summer, examine current political climate. The MPHSA Board Policy Committee proposes usually 5 priorities and is voted on by the board. The agenda is then set.

Current Priorities:

- Public Health Funding, mainly protecting tobacco master settlement money
 - As e-cigarette sales increase, money from this source decreases, expected to drop from ~55million to ~35million. Currently, around 70% of funds goes to treating



tobacco caused illness. It is expected that prevention efforts increasingly be cut to continue this service at the CDC recommended level.

- Supporting Local Public Health
- Supporting the State's Recognition of Wabanaki Sovereignty
- Ending the Sale of all Flavored Tobacco Products
- Preventing Youth and High Risk Adult Use of Cannabis and Alcohol Use

Cannabis and Alcohol bills are not hear in front of health and human services committee, instead, it is presented to the veterans and legal affairs committee. Public health perspective would be appreciated.

The current focus is on a bill that would create a process and commission to examine other funding models for public health, as in Maine funding can fluctuate by several million dollars every two years.
