# Background

- Opening Discussions: December 2019 SCC Meeting.
- Planned In-Person Meetings in Spring/Summer 2020.
- COVID-19 Postponed Progress and Suggested Different Model.
- Created and tested virtual platform for State Public Health System Assessment, conducted in August 2021.
- Assesses ten essential public health services.
- Utilized national assessment instrument developed and tested by National Public Health Performance Standards.

# Ten Essential Public Health Services

# Essential Public Health Services (1994)

- 1. Monitor Health Status.
- 2. Diagnose and Investigate
- 3. Inform and Educate
- 4. Mobilize Partnerships
- 5. Develop Policies and Plans
- 6. Enforce Laws and Regulations
- 7. Link People to Needed Services
- 8. Assure Competent Workforce
- 9. Evaluate Health Services
- 10. Research for New Insights

#### **Essential Public Health Services (2020)**

- 1. Monitor Health Status (and factors influencing health)
- 2. Diagnose and Investigate
- 3. Communicate Effectively (Improve) health
- 4. Strengthen and Mobilize Partnerships (and Communities)
- 5. Create/Champion/Implement Policies and Plans
- 6. Use legal/regulatory actions to improve health
- 7. Assure effective system that is equitable.
- 8. Build/Support Skilled and Diverse Workforce
- 9. Improve and innovate public health functions through evaluation, research, and QI.
- 10. Build and maintain a strong organizations infrastructure for public health.

#### LPHSA Instrument V3.0 (based on 1994 EPHS)

- LPHSA is part of the Mobilizing for Planning and Partnership (MAPP) process
- One of four assessments where the results are integrated and synthesized into a community health improvement plan.
- LPHSA Instrument matches well to the SPHSA Instrument (SPHSA is not part of MAPP).
- New MAPP process is just being rolled out in Fall 2022.
  - New LPHSA is totally different and combines other assessments and strategies.
- Some discussion with National Association of City and County Health Officials (NACCHO) regarding a pilot of new MAPP in 2023 (potentially one district would pilot it).

# Virtual Model

- Specific Sector Experts Invited to Specific EPHS.
- Invited Participants asked to review standards pre-session.
- Use zoom platform functionality
  - Polls for consensus voting on questions
  - Chat and Closed Caption Transcript for collecting comments
  - Recording of Session
- Use Ideaboardz for facilitating Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Priorities (SWOP)
- Options for Facilitation
  - Ten EPHS two-hour sessions per eight districts (80 sessions)
  - Five Combined EPHS two-and-one-half hour sessions per eight districts (40 sessions)



# Assessment Voting

- Consensus-building process
- Based on Optimal Performance

Optimal Activity (76–100%)	Greater than 75% of the activity described within the question is met.
Significant Activity (51–75%)	Greater than 50% but no more than 75% of the activity described within the question is met.
Moderate Activity (26–50%)	Greater than 25% but no more than 50% of the activity described within the question is met.
Minimal Activity (1–25%)	Greater than zero but no more than 25% of the activity described within the question is met.
No Activity (0%)	0% or absolutely no activity.
