| District Visits with<br>Executive<br>Leadership – | Started in July in Aroostook County and will finish up in late<br>September/early October.   |  |
| Nancy Beardsley                                   | Predominant reason to visit was to thank partners for the past couple of years.  |  |
|   | Homelessness and food security were the most consistently identified concerns from each district.  |  |
|   | Another common theme: when meeting with community-based<br>orgs or infrastructure partners- recruiting and retaining staff is<br>still a struggle.   |  |
|   | DLs assisted with access to places to have not traditionally been recognized.  |  |
|   | Aroostook visited with St John Valley Pharmacy, who did a huge<br>amount of vaccinations at long term care facilities and did long<br>excursions to southern Maine as well.  |  |
|   | Appreciate that discussions are also including community health, not just diseases   |  |
|   | A lot of smaller orgs mentioned having to expand their missions<br>and adapt their models. Food pantries, for instance, had to figure<br>out delivery options. FQHCs have also taken on food insecurity.<br>Does that help their mission, or does that stretch their staff even<br>thinner?  |  |
|   | We often talk about issues as if they're not separate – so many issues are closely intertwined. Food insecurity, mental health, substance use, for example.  |  |
|   | In Midcoast meeting, had a good discussion about food insecurity.  |  |
|   | MaineHealth is screening our patients for food insecurity, with the goal of screening all inpatients and all primary care patients by a year from now, including providing a 3-day emergency bag of food (thanks to our partnership with Good Shepherd). We have 3 hospital campus food pantries (at Franklin, Stephens, and very soon at MMC), including emerging Food as Medicine programs providing food, education (e.g. Cooking Matters, chronic disease self-management), and social connectivity to cohorts of people with food insecurity and chronic diseases. This all would not be possible without strong partnerships with Good Shepherd and Hannaford. But it's beyond what health care thought their missions were a few years ago! |  |
