	Maine received \$32.1 million in Federal grant funding: Approximately, \$3 million towards increase data and reporting needs, \$11 million towards infrastructure support, and \$18 million towards partner mobilization.	
	Within this funding, Ian noted two future positions within the OPHE, as well as the increased trainings and professional development opportunities to come. The Local Public Health Systems Assessments (LPHSA) at the District level will help bring access to funds for future projects around infrastructure.
