SHIP/Accreditatio n/PHHS Block Grant Update, Nancy Birkhimer, Maine CDC	Nancy introduced Rose Swenson and Donna Burke from Health Resources in Action. The presenters asked what the participants wanted to get out of the SHIP and gave a kickoff presentation.	Link to SHIP Kickoff presentation
Maine CDC's Investment in Public Health District, Maine CDC	James introduced the new public health educators in the Western and Aroostook Districts.  New federal disparities funds are for gaps that were uncovered during Covid - \$71,000 per district. If a district opts out, their portion will be redistributed to other districts equally. Districts decide to opt in or out by September 26. Money is intended for infrastructure development, not programming. Examples – fridges, communication equipment for fire department, building PPE storage facilities. Money expires June 30 2024.  Question: further define the partnership – is it the DL?  Answer: CDC's role is to approve that it falls within parameters of grant.
