



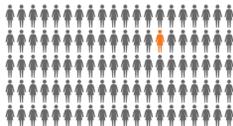
Congenital cytomegalovirus (CMV) is the most common viral infection, and the leading cause of non-genetic hearing loss, that infants are born with in the United States.
