Contact Investigations:



 31% of patients were hospitalized Baby Boomer 17.3[%]

Were born between 1945-1965



used non-injection drugs

- 100% of patients had symptoms
- 100% of patients had elevated liver enzyme lab results
- 64% of patients had jaundice
- 24% of patients were coinfected with hepatitis C

Prevention:

- Get vaccinated against hepatitis B
- Do not share syringes or injection kit equipment
- Practice safer sex
- Do not share razors, toothbrushes, or tattooing or piercing needles
- Get tested for hepatitis B, especially if you are a person who injects drugs, were ever incarcerated, were born between 1945-1965, or received an unlicensed tattoo
- If you have hepatitis B, seek medical care
