## TICK-BORNE DISEASES IN YORK DISTRICT:

Maine saw a record number of confirmed Lyme disease cases in 2023.

Last year, York District saw 331 cases of Lyme Disease, 54 cases of Anaplasmosis, and 21 cases of Babesiosis.

With a record number of Lyme Disease in 2023, coupled with a warmer-than-average winter, Maine CDC encourages continued precautions against tick bites this winter.

York District has already seen cases of Lyme Disease this year (see map below).
