Pathway to Employment

Working with Vocational Rehabilitation (VR)

Step 1: Contact your local VR office

If you want help finding a job, you may begin by making an appointment with your local Vocational Rehabilitation office. The Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, also known as "VR" is a Department of Labor program that helps people to get jobs.

Arrange transportation now.

Make sure you will arrive at least 15 minutes early!

Step 2: Gather Information

Next, you need to prepare for your first VR meeting. You need to gather basic information about yourself.

Step 3: Look Professional

Treat this meeting like a real interview! Shower, fix your hair and dress professionally.

Step 4: Go to your meeting

The VR Counselor will sit down with you and your support person if you ask them and will help you to complete an application for services.

The sharing of information about you and your medical history will happen. You or your guardian will have to sign

releases so that VR can get the medical information they need. This will help VR to understand your medical condition or any disability you may have and what help you need to get and keep a job

Developing an employment plan with your VR counselor may take several months. You will be given time to explore different job possibilities and may be offered a career exploration workshop.

After your meeting, VR will get information from your doctors and determine eligibility. You will get a letter in the mail (your caseworker and guardian should, too) saying if VR can help you or not.
