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Trading Partner Certification Status



- 430 trading partners are certified to submit HIPAA Version 5010 transactions and 88 trading partners were certified since the last PAG/TAG meeting.
- There are 27 trading partners who are not HIPAA Version 5010 certified for 837 transactions. Of which, 23 are in the testing process and 4 have not started testing.

Acceptance of HIPAA Version 5010 Transactions



- MIHMS started accepting HIPAA version 5010 transactions on Friday, February 24.
- Since this time, MIHMS has successfully processed:
 - 7885 HIPAA Version 5010 837 files
 - 137 HIPAA Version 5010 835 files
- Molina will continue to receive 4010 and 5010 COBA transactions until CMS no longer processes 4010 COBA transactions.

Dual Processing—Update



- MaineCare is extending the deadline for HIPAA Version 5010 compliance to align with CMS' announcement that it will not initiate enforcement of HIPAA Version 5010 until June 30, 2012.
- On July 1, 2012, any HIPAA Version 4010 transaction submitted to MaineCare will be rejected.
- If you are a trading partner that is unable to submit 5010 transactions after June 30, 2012, your claims submission will need to be via Direct Data Entry (DDE) or through paper claims.

HIPAA Version 5010 – 835 Issues



- TR5829 was resolved and closed in March. Providers are no longer experiencing QNXT data errors when generating 835s and “large volume” 835s are now being regularly generated.
- TR5795 is in UAT testing. Each week, some out of balance 835s are generated. Molina is identifying these as they arise and fixing them.

ICD-10 Status



- CMS issued a notice of proposed rule making on Monday, April 9th. The proposed rule:
 - Extends the compliance date for ICD-10 until October 1, 2014.
 - Recommends the creation of a unique health plan identifier (HPID) for electronic health care transactions and suggests the adoption of a data element that will serve as an “other entity” identifier (OEID) for entities that are not health plans, health care providers, or individuals, but that need to be identified in standard transactions.
 - Specifies other circumstances where an organization covered health care provider must require certain non-covered individual health care providers who are prescribers to obtain and disclose an NPI.

ICD-10 Status *(continued)*



- All covered entities, excluding small health plans, would be required to comply with HPID/OEID on October 1, 2014. Small health plans would be required to comply with HPID/OEID on October 1, 2015.
- Covered entities would have 180 days from the October 1, 2012 effective date of the file rule to comply with the additional NPI requirement.
- MaineCare has started scenario planning discussions on how a one year delay would impact MIHMS and the project schedule.
- Similar to HIPAA Version 5010, the adoption of ICD-10 will require MaineCare and trading partner collaboration to achieve ICD-10 compliance.
