

## Quality Indicators for the MaineCare Primary Care Physician Incentive Payment (PCPIP) \*

1. <b>Unduplicated MaineCare Members Served per Period (Access/Panel Size):</b> The number of MaineCare members enrolled at a service location (SL) during the reporting period. ** PCP ASSIGNMENT ALGORITHM HAS CHANGED** Some members are enrolled with a rendering provider as the PCP. PCPs are attributed to the SL where most of their MaineCare services were performed for the reporting period. All members assigned to those PCPs are then attributed to that SL. (Note: To assure that providers practicing at multiple sites are appropriately reimbursed, the provider's time at each site is assessed monthly. If a provider is at multiple sites during a month, that month is divided by that number of sites. (i.e., if a provider is at two sites in the same month, the provider counts as .5 months for each site)	All			Measurement Year

4. <b>Well-Child Visits in the First 15 Months of Life:</b> Percentage of members who turned 15 months of age during the measurement year and had at least one well-child visit (Note: To provide the physician with additional information, the average number of well-child visits for these children will also be reported on the PCPIP, but will not influence payment on this measure)	C	>= 6 Months	13 Months From Date of Birth + 1 Month Up to 15 Months	Between Date of Birth and 15 Months.	✓

\* Note: Many of these measures were developed based on the Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS) measures developed by the National Center for Quality Assurance. In some instances the measures were modified to address data and population specifics of MaineCare members. To be eligible for the quality/prevention measures, MaineCare members served must have been enrolled at least six months in the managed care program.

22. <b>Adult Pathways to Excellence (PTE) Measure:</b> This measure uses the Maine Health Management Coalition's (MHMC) Pathways to Excellence (PTE) metrics. PTE performance is now qualified as good, better or best. Currently, only the office system recognition is awarded a "best" recognition. Diabetes and cardiac care are recognized as good or better. A site was awarded 0 points for no information, 1 point for a good recognition, 2 points for better recognition and 3 points for best. Points are totaled across all three areas of recognition to result in a score ranging from 0 to 7. Sites are then ranked by this total score.	A	N/A	N/A	N/A	

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
