


September Provider Readiness Survey



The MaineCare ICD-10 Provider Readiness Survey is a short online survey (8-10 questions) that is conducted periodically. These began in April 2013. The link to the September survey will be distributed via MaineCare's listserv in the first two weeks of September and the survey will remain open for approximately 4 weeks.

Survey respondents will be required to identify NPI/API and Name to avoid duplicate entries and accurately track providers over time. We will compare this survey's data to the survey conducted in April to track progress in preparing for ICD-10.

MaineCare ICD-10 Provider Readiness Survey [April 2013]

What best describes the current preparedness of your organization for ICD-10?

- Awareness - ensuring key stakeholders understand ICD-10 and are prepared to support the implementation program
- Assessment - establishing the foundation for the ICD-10 remediation by identifying the ICD-10 impacts
- Requirements - defining the specific changes which need to be made to a business process or a system/software to achieve ICD-10 compliance
- Design - creating a draft of the proposed change to the business process or system/software
- Implementation - remediating the business process or system/software to make the process or system/software ICD-10 compliant
- Internal Testing - verifying and validating the accuracy of the ICD-10 changes
- External Testing - collaborating with business partners to test ICD-10 transactions

Overview of ICD-10

The International Classification of Diseases (ICD) is the international standard diagnostic classification for general epidemiological, health management, and clinical use. As part of HIPAA Administrative Simplification, the federal government mandated that all health care entities upgrade diagnosis (ICD-9-CM) and inpatient procedure codes (ICD-9-PCS) to ICD-10-CM and ICD-10-PCS, respectively.

The ICD-10 code set is a full replacement of the ICD-9 code set that provides additional granularity for diagnosis and procedure codes. ICD-10 addresses structural and space limitations of ICD-9 and provides additional detail to support emerging needs. Provided below is a representation of the number of codes and structural changes anticipated due to the transition to ICD-10.


General Equivalence Mappings (GEMs)

GEMs is a tool that defines reasonable alternatives for mappings between ICD-9 and ICD-10. This tool is freely available from CMS to crosswalk codes between ICD-9 to ICD-10:



There are several types of matches between the two code sets: no mapping, 1-to-1 exact match, 1-to-1 approximate match, 1-to-1 approximate match with multiple choices, 1-to-many single scenario, and complex mappings.

Project Update



The MaineCare ICD-10 Project recently progressed from Analysis and Design into the Development phase. Key accomplishments from Analysis and Design include:

- Mapping of all codes from ICD-9 to ICD-10 covered in policy
- Completion of analysis and remediation of MaineCare criteria sheets
- Updating MaineCare policy based on the ICD-10 transition
- Configuring all ICD-10 codes that will be covered under MaineCare policy into the claims processing system
- Creating the Integrated Test Plan to test ICD-10 transactions before the go-live date

In the Development phase, MaineCare will be implementing necessary updates identified during the analysis of business processes and systems. We expect internal testing to begin in the 1st quarter of 2014, and pilot testing to begin in the 3rd quarter of 2014.

Pilot testing participants will include a cross-section of the trading partner population who submit claims for services that are available to MaineCare members. During the second quarter of 2014, a member of the MaineCare Services ICD-10 Pilot Testing Team will contact trading partners for pilot testing.
