The new ambulatory surgical center will consist of two (2) operating rooms and two (2) procedure rooms, as well as waiting and recovery rooms. The total projected capital expenditures for the Project is \$4.3 million. The total projected incremental third-year operating costs for the Project is \$2.6 million.

Construction of the Project is anticipated to commence immediately after CON approval is received. The anticipated date of completion is six months after construction commences. Accordingly, the plan is for the Project to be constructed and completed in calendar year 2016.

If CON review is required, we intend to submit our CON application as soon as practicable following the technical assistance meeting.
