This correspondence responds to yours dated April 21, 2015 in which Portland Endoscopy Center proposes to relocate its Ambulatory Surgical Center from 1200 Congress Street, Portland to 161 Marginal Way also located in Portland. The capital cost for this project is estimated to be \$3,233,395 of which \$1,720,747 is related to the floor where the endoscopy center will be located although other parts of the physicians practice will reside on that floor.
