

CHILDREN'S BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES (CBHS) FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHO IS ELEIGIBLE TO RECEIVE SERVICES FROM CBHS?

A youth who:

- Is 0 up to 21 years old
- Has <u>MaineCare</u> (or those under age 19 with MaineCare's <u>Katie Beckett</u> waiver option)
- Has impairment in functioning at home, school, or in the community
- Qualifies with a mental health diagnosis, autism, or developmental disability
- Is under age 6 and at risk of developing or exhibiting behavioral health challenges

WHAT SERVICES DOES CBHS OFFER?

CBHS provides information and assistance with referrals for children and youth with developmental disabilities/delays, Autism Spectrum Disorders, mental health disorders, and intellectual disabilities, and contracts with private providers to provide treatment and support services for those needs.

An array of home and community-based behavioral health treatment <u>services</u> are offered to meet the specific treatment needs of the youth and family:

- Crisis Services
- Targeted Case Management
- Behavioral Health Home
- Outpatient Treatment
- Rehabilitative and Community Services (RCS)
- Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)
- Intensive Home-Based Treatments:
 - o Home and Community Treatment (HCT)
 - o Multi-Systemic Therapy (MST)
 - o Multi-Systemic Therapy for Problem Sexual Behavior (MST-PSB)
 - o Functional Family Therapy (FFT)
- Children's Residential Care Facilities Treatment (CRCF)
- Medication Management
- Inpatient Psychiatric Hospital

HOW CAN I REFER A YOUTH FOR CBHS SERVICES?

A parent or legal guardian or any support entities such as schools, primary care physicians, juvenile corrections offers, with guardian permission, may refer to any CBHS services.
