Shellfish Harvesting Area Classification-Notification of Changes

November 30, 2018

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Under the authority of 12 M.R.S.A. § 6172; the Commissioner has made the following change to Area No. 64-B; this notice repeals the mussel, European oyster and surf/hen clam closure due to a decreased risk of contamination by naturally occurring marine biotoxins. All other existing pollution and biotoxin closures remain in effect.

The boundary descriptions of the area are as follows (struck text is being removed and underlined text is being added):

- ~~A. Effective immediately, because of paralytic shellfish poisoning (PSP), it shall be unlawful to dig, take or possess any mussels, European oysters (*Ostrea edulis*) or surf/hen clams (*Spisula solidissima*) from the shores, flats and waters of the following areas:~~

~~East of a line drawn south from Point of Maine (Machiasport) to the limit of U.S. jurisdiction; AND west of the U.S./Canadian border to the limit of U.S. jurisdiction.~~


~~EXCEPTION 64-B-01: mussels and European oysters (*Ostrea edulis*) may be harvested west and north of a line beginning at the northern end of Gove Point (Lubec) running east to the tip of the prominent point located approximately 500 yards west of the western end of the Eastport Airport runway.~~

~~EXCEPTION 64-B-02: mussels and European oysters (*Ostrea edulis*) may be harvested north of a line beginning at Long Point (Machiasport), running southeast to the northern point of Hog Island (Machiasport); AND east of a line beginning at the northern point of Hog Island (Machiasport), running southeast to the tip of Sprague Neck (Cutler).~~

~~EXCEPTION 64-B-03: mussels and European oysters (*Ostrea edulis*) may be harvested south of a line beginning at the northeast tip of Lubec Neck (Lubec) running east to the U.S./Canadian border; AND north of a line beginning at the northeast tip of West Quoddy Head (Lubec) running east to the U.S./Canadian border.~~
