Thank you for the Maine Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry's June 5, 2014, request that changes to the Natural Resources Protection Act, Shoreland Zoning Act, and water quality, solid waste and oil spill clean-up-related laws to be incorporated into the Maine Coastal Program. You requested that the changes described below be incorporated as routine program changes (RPCs), pursuant to Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA) regulations at 15 C.F.R. part 923, subpart H, and Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) Program Change Guidance (July 1996). OCRM received the request on June 10, 2014, and OCRM's decision deadline is July 9, 2014.

Based on our review of your submission, we concur that the changes are RPCs and we approve the incorporation of the changes as enforceable and non-enforceable policies of the Maine Coastal Program. Federal Consistency will apply to the approved changes to enforceable policies only after you publish notice of this approval pursuant to 15 C.F.R. § 923.84(b)(4) and OCRM's Addendum to the July 1996 Program Change Guidance (November 2013). Please include in the public notice the list of changes provided in this letter, and please send a copy of the notice to OCRM.
