# SAT School Day: Roles and Responsibilities

**Test Center Supervisor** – Primary contact for both the College Board and ETS

- All aspects of the SAT School Day administration
- Test center set-up (rooms/staffing), receiving/securing/distributing test materials
- Monitoring of all test day activities/staff, packaging/returning test materials, completing Supervisor Irregularity Reports

**Associate Supervisor(s)** – Each test room requires one (1) Assoc. Supervisor

- Accountable for everyone/everything in the testing room
- Management of all testing materials, conduct the testing, monitor test-takers to ensure a fair administration
- Current/retired teachers, counselors, administrators, or other educators who are familiar with test administration and/or classroom management.

**Proctor(s) and Hall Monitors** – Assist the Test Center & Associate Supervisor(s)

- Do NOT administer the test
- Assist with setting up the testing area and monitor testing; patrol the hallways during testing to make sure the testing area remains quiet and secure.
- May be members of the school staff or other adults who have been trained to help Test Center Supervisors and Associate Supervisors.

# SAT School Day: Roles and Responsibilities (cont.)

## **Principal** – Primary instructional contact

- Receiving/distributing general information about SAT School Day
- Receiving/distributing information about the Official SAT Practice through Khan Academy
- Receiving the school's allotment of SAT School Day Fee Waivers

## **SSD Coordinator** – Liaison with the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) office

- Submitting accommodation requests for all students who request them at his/her school
- Administering the test to students who have a non-standard administration of the test and appear on the Non-standard Administration Roster (NAR)

# SAT School Day

## Student Data Questionnaire (SDQ) & Student Search Service (SSS)

- **Connects students to more than 1,100 colleges and scholarship programs without being solicited by commercial entities**
  - programs of study
  - application processes
  - financial aid packages
  - campus life
- **Opt In Policy / Opt Out Policy**
  - Students may opt-in by answering "yes" to the Student Search Service question on the answer sheet when taking the PSAT/NMSQT or SAT
  - Participation is completely voluntary; students can opt-out at any time
- **Maine's SAT School Day Students MUST HAVE Informed Parental Consent**

# SAT School Day

## Student Data Questionnaire (SDQ) & Student Search Service (SSS)

### Maine's SAT School Day Students MUST HAVE Informed Parental Consent

- Schools will send SDQ/SSS Informed Parental Consent Form home with all participating students
- Schools will keep SDQ/SSS Informed Parental Consent Form, signed by parent/guardian, on file; DO NOT send back to the College Board and/or ETS
- Schools will return paper SDQ forms for all students who have returned their Informed Parental Consent

# SAT School Day: Fee Waiver

- Sent to the Principal approximately three (3) weeks before the test administration for distribution to eligible students
- Provides eligible students with:
  - Four (4) free score sends to use at any time; fee waiver code required
  - Access to the *Question and Answer Service* for April 12, 2016; students must call Customer Service and provide their fee waiver code required
  - Four (4) College Application Fee Waivers; delivered automatically to the student's College Board online account in August 2016

## October SAT® School Day Fee Waiver

SAT® School Day students who are eligible for SAT fee waivers can qualify for the following benefits:

- Four additional score reports over the user's testing lifetime (maximum value, \$45)
- Four college application fee waivers to use in applying to participating colleges for free, delivered directly to high school seniors
- Free Student Answer Service (SAS) (maximum value, \$18)

All required fields must be completed for this card to be accepted as valid.

# SAT School Day: Test Center Set-Up

All schools where testing will take place must be set-up as an **SAT School Day-specific** test center.



- Schools already established as a Saturday test center must complete a separate CMF for the SAT School Day administration; the Saturday Test Center Code will be different than the SAT School Day Test Center Code
- Schools that have not returned their SAT School Day Center Master Form (CMF) CANNOT administer the test

# SAT School Day: Student Registration

- Maine is participating in **Electronic Bulk Registration**; the Maine Department of Education will work directly with the College Board for uploading the necessary information for all 3<sup>rd</sup> year students required to participate
- Test Center Supervisors will receive a shipment which will include a guide for students about SAT School Day; all students **MUST** receive the guide
- After the Electronic Bulk Registration File is submitted by the State and processed, admission tickets will be mailed to students' homes
- A second set of admissions tickets will be mailed to the school, to arrive no later than 4/6/16
- Standby paper registration on test day is available (\*only for SAT School Day); each school will receive a limited number of standby registration forms

# Requesting Accommodations for Students with Disabilities

- Accommodations are requested through the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) office using the SSD Online System.
- Requests for accommodations should be submitted by the school's designated SSD Coordinator(s) by **February 24, 2016**.
- Any student that participated in other College Board assessments and received approved accommodations will not need to reapply unless their accommodation needs change.
  - This includes PSAT/NMSQT and Advanced Placement tests
- For students that have a temporary condition caused by injury or accident, do NOT submit via SSD Online. Instead, complete the Temporary Conditions Form available on our website.

# Requesting Accommodations for Students with Disabilities

- If your school does not have an SSD Coordinator, complete the SSD Coordinator Form online at <https://www.collegeboard.org/students-with-disabilities/ssd-online/get-access>
- Schools may have more than one (1) SSD Coordinator
  - The Primary SSD Coordinator receives all communications
  - Other SSD Coordinators may access & utilize SSD Online
- Schools should request College Board accommodations for all students with the exception of the following accommodations types:
  - Reading test directions in the student's native language
  - Use of a bilingual word-for-word, non-electronic translation glossary for English language learners
  - Signing of the content and test questions in American Sign Language (ASL)
  - Student responds in American Sign Language (ASL)
- Students who test with one of the above accommodations will NOT receive a college reportable score
- Requests for State Allowed Accommodations are also submitted via SSD Online by the school's designated SSD Coordinator(s)

8:30 a.m.	Begin testing.
11:45 a.m. for SAT 12:52 p.m. for SAT with Essay	Pencils down for standard test administrations.


- Schools can vary from this schedule by up to 30 minutes.
- If a school needs to vary from this schedule by more than 30 minutes they need to contact SAT School Day Customer Support for approval

# SAT School Day: Test Center Supervisor & Staff Training

- **Test Center Supervisor Training**
  - **Mandatory**
  - Access available through College Board Professional Account
  - Modularized; approximately 45-60 minutes to complete
  - Must be completed by each individual supervisor
- **Associate Supervisor Training**
  - Online Training, similar to Test Center Supervisor Training
  - Available through College Board Professional Account
  - Approximately 25 minutes to complete
- **Training Kit**
  - Hard copies of manuals, test day forms and publications
  - Shipped to schools **in early February**
- **Proctor and Hall Monitor Training**
  - Printed materials available, distributed by Test Center Supervisor

# SAT School Day: Makeup Administration

- Students who miss the initial test administration, will be required to take the SAT on the designated makeup date - **April 27, 2016**
- Test Center Supervisors and SSD Coordinators will receive an email reminding them of the makeup date with a link to request the necessary makeup materials.
- Test materials will be sent based on the counts provided in the online form, *Early Reporting Form- Absentees & Irregularities*

# SAT School Day: Student Score Reporting

- **All** students who take the SAT are eligible for 4 free “score sends”
- Students have until **April 21, 2016 at 11:59PM EST** to add score sends to their registration
- After April 21, 2016 students are still able to have their scores sent to colleges and scholarship organizations, but there is a fee





# SAT School Day: Preparing Students & Educators

## Alignment of Maine Learning Results to SAT

- **All** of the Maine **Reading and Language Anchor Standards** are addressed, in whole or in part, on the redesigned SAT
- **Seven (7) of the ten (10)** Maine **Writing Anchor Standards** are addressed, in whole or in part, on the redesigned SAT
- Speaking and listening are not addressed on the redesigned SAT
- All but two of the elements in the SAT are addressed directly by Maine standards:
  - text complexity in Writing and Language, which is not addressed by Maine standards
  - the SAT Essay's requirement for accuracy in representation of source texts, which is implicit in Maine's research-related standards.
- All skills measured in the redesigned SAT appear in the Maine Standards for High School **Mathematics**


