<b>Priority Intelligence Requirements (PIR)</b>	
PIR 1. CBRN attack within Continental United States (CONUS).	Flash
PIR 2. Natural disaster within Maine.	Flash
PIR 3. Crash of MENG aviation.	Flash
PIR 4. Threats to/against MENG units, facilities, locations, or personnel to include but not limited to terrorism, bomb threats, or threats of physical violence.	Flash
PIR 5. Cyber-attack that directly affects MENG mission.	Flash
PIR 6. Significant attack where Maine Soldiers/Airmen are present.	Flash
PIR 7. Natural disaster that could potentially impact Maine.	Priority
<b>Friendly Forces Information Requirements (FFIR)</b>	
FFIR 1. Break-in/theft/or other criminal activity at an Armory or other DVEM/MENG facility.	Flash
FFIR 2. Death of Maine National Guard personnel regardless of duty status.	Flash
FFIR 3. Civilian death, injury, or medical event requiring medical assistance occurring on any MENG property to include training sites.	Flash
FFIR 4. Class A, B, C or D mishaps IAW DODI 6055.07 resulting in damage to civilian property or civilian injury as a result of MENG operations or damage to MENG facilities, equipment or injury to personnel.	Flash
FFIR 5. Medical event requiring hospitalization to on-duty Maine National Guard personnel.	Immediate
FFIR 6. Deployment of Maine Guard Aviation assets in support of NGCS or DSCA missions.	Immediate
FFIR 7. Deployment of 11 <sup>th</sup> CST assets in support of NGCS or DSCA missions.	Immediate
FFIR 8. Changes to a sourced or deploying unit that affects mobilization.	Priority
FFIR 9. Soldiers/Airmen returning from OCONUS for emergency leave.	Priority
FFIR 10. Interactions with Law Enforcement that results in an arrest or summons to appear in court.	Priority
FFIR 11. Actions by military personnel with potential negative media attention.	Priority
FFIR 12. Confirmation of or change to return travel plans to Maine of any Maine National Guard unit or individually mobilized Soldier/Airman.	Priority
FFIR 13. Damage to MENG facilities that affect operations for more than 24 hours.	Routine
FFIR 14. Inquiries from Congressional Delegations or State Agencies.	Routine
FFIR 15. Involuntary recall of MENG personnel on orders.	Routine
FFIR 16. Notification of potential sourcing/deployment of Maine Guard unit.	Routine
FFIR 17. Any other events Commanders/AOs/Directors deem significant enough to report.	TBD

1. <b>Flash</b>	<b>Notify Now!</b> By phone with follow-up via email	30 mins
2. Immediate	Notify via email, phone, or voice during normal waking hours	1 Hour
3. Priority	Notify via email, phone, or voice during duty hours	2 Hours
4. Routine	Notify via email, phone, or voice when convenient	4 Hours
