

Enclosure 2: Examples of Reportable Serious Incidents (Actual, Alleged, or Suspected)

CCIR. Reportable incidents listed in the CCIR. (See Enclosure 1)

CIL. Unofficial release of Critical Information (EEFI). (See Enclosure 3)

Death or Serious Injury:

1. All serious injuries or deaths occurring on National Guard property, or during National Guard training or events.
2. Fire or explosions resulting in death or injury, or damage to property.
3. Death of Soldier's or Airman's close family member which is deemed to be criminal in nature.
4. MeANG Units: Report all injuries that result in missed duty days.

Criminal/Terrorist:

1. Criminal, terrorist, or other threats directed against or involving any government personnel, equipment, or facilities.
2. Any incidents of MENG personnel being arrested, detained, or investigated for criminal conduct.
3. Serious domestic violence incidents. "Serious Domestic" generally includes any incident of domestic violence that is a violation of a protective order, or where a weapon is involved; the victim suffers a broken limb, is injured during pregnancy, is sexually abused, is choked, or strangled or is admitted to the hospital because of injuries.
4. Maltreatment (assaults, abuse) by a trainer, supervisor, or cadre.
5. Violations that include bribery, conflict of interest, or graft.
6. Single loss of 10 or more DOD ID cards.
7. Attempted theft, loss, suspected theft or recovered arms, ammunition, or explosives.
8. Theft, wrongful appropriation, or willful destruction of government property or funds.
9. Loss, theft, wrongful disposition, willful destruction, or mismanagement of sensitive items, government credit cards, military vehicles, or GSA vehicles.

Enclosure 2: Examples of Reportable Serious Incidents (Actual, Alleged, or Suspected)

Threats and Harassment:

1. Threats and harassment made to/against MENG units, locations, and individuals; to include but not limited to threats of physical violence, acts of intimidation, and verbal harassment.

Other:

1. Incidents that seriously degrade unit operational or training readiness.

2. Any other serious event that may cause negative publicity or official inquiry.

3. Traffic accidents involving MENG personnel while on duty are reportable to ME JOC Generally, these are serious accidents totaling \$20,000 or more, or a nonfatal injury or illness results in loss of work or hospitalization.
