I was very delighted to welcome one hundred and fifty-three participants to the 7th annual Comprehensive Sexuality Education Conference held on April 5, 2012. This conference is a great time to listen to nationally known speakers regarding CSE, network, stay up with current trends, and gather additional resources.

Elizabeth Haller, keynote speaker, provided a national perspective on sexual health education and also discussed Maine's current status. While we do have many successes, she did point out that only 42% of Maine middle schools and 78% of Maine high

schools taught all of the specific HIV, other sexually transmitted diseases, and pregnancy prevention topics deemed necessary to help reduce risk behaviors in students.

I encourage you to look at what you are currently teaching to determine if you are covering all of the recommended topics (see pg. 2).

MAY IS HEPATITIS AWARENESS MONTH



Hepatitis Awareness Month is a nationwide observance coordinated by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Division of Viral Hepatitis. The goal is to raise awareness of the facts about viral hepatitis and to promote screening, testing and vaccination.

In Maine, an estimated 21,000 to 26,000 Mainers are living with chronic Hepatitis C infection. Without testing for infection, many chronically infected persons are unaware of their infection until symptoms of advanced liver disease appear. This means they are missing critical opportunities to access treatment and to learn how to prevent spreading the infection to others.
