RE: Applications for Student Member to the State Board of Education

It is time for the Maine State Board of Education to open the application process that will end with the appointment of a new student member. This year we are accepting applications from students who reside in and attend school in the Second Congressional District. The student applicant must be a current sophomore in good standing.

Student members serve the Maine State Board of Education as members with voice but no vote. The Board will expect student members to have all the responsibilities and privileges of regular Board members. The responsibilities include: being informed about current education issues, carefully preparing for regular monthly meetings, and participating actively in the discussions of the Board. The State Board has day long meetings on the second Wednesday after the first Tuesday of each month. Other Board work is available according to the preferences of Board members. The privileges include: a per diem of \$55.00 per day, mileage reimbursement, and an extraordinary opportunity to practice civic engagement while serving as both a representative of Maine students and an active Maine education leader.

The State Board believes that strong student voices will enrich our work and the educational community in Maine. We certainly appreciate your role in this endeavor and in helping us move forward on this third year of student membership. We ask that you personally make copies of the enclosed application form available to interested students in your school.

Students and parents should be aware that the content of applications becomes available to the public when access is requested. The nomination process will be moving quickly this year as we work in cooperation with the Office of the Governor to bring a nomination to the Joint Standing Committee for Education and Cultural Affairs before the early adjournment of the Legislature in April. Therefore, the entire process will be following the schedule below:

- February 11, 2010 – Applications accepted until 5:00 PM on this date
- February 12, 2010 – Semi-Finalists are invited to an interview
- February 22, 2010 – Interviews
- February 24, 2010 – Names of three finalists sent to the Office of the Governor

Please note that the deadline for our receipt of the application and accompanying materials is February 11, 2010. Completed applications should be addressed to Mary Becker, Maine State Board of Education, 23 State House Station, Augusta, ME 04333-0023 and received by 5:00 PM, February 11, 2010.
