Moreover, the statute in *New Mexico Youth Organized* does not resemble Maine’s BQC law. By using a \$5,000 threshold, Maine has narrowly tailored its statute to regulate only those raising or spending significant amounts of money to initiate or influence a Maine ballot measure.

II. The First Circuit’s decision that the definitions of “contribution” in sections 1056-B(2-A)(B) and (C) are valid under the First and Fourteenth Amendments properly applied this Court’s precedents and does not conflict with other circuits’ decisions.

Relying primarily on *Wisconsin Right to Life*, petitioners argue that review is warranted to clarify that a state may not “classify a group as a PAC based on unspecified donor intent and perception.” Pet. 22. Petitioners’ argument is based on a faulty premise: the First Circuit held that the statutory definitions at issue do “not require an assessment of what any particular contributor actually believed” or intended, or any “inquiry into what the parties in fact understood,” and thus avoided “the pitfalls of subjective standards.” Pet. App. 25a & 28a. Whether a given communication is covered by the statute depends on the “objectively reasonable meaning” of the language of the petitioners’ solicitation.⁷ Pet. App. 31a.

⁷ Petitioners will likely point out that the Maine superior court, in dictum, recently suggested that a donor’s knowledge and belief may be part of the inquiry under section 1056-B(2-A).

1. As an initial matter, petitioners do not challenge the First Circuit’s holding that they lack standing even to assert a facial challenge to section 1056-B. In fact, they completely ignore that part of the court’s opinion, which forecloses their vagueness claim under this Court’s precedents. *See Holder v. Humanitarian Law Project*, 130 S. Ct. 2705, 2719 (2010) (“[a] plaintiff who engages in some conduct that is clearly proscribed cannot complain of the vagueness of the law as applied to the conduct of others”). Nor do petitioners challenge the First Circuit’s criticism that they “do not address in their brief the vagueness problem with respect to donations received following any specific communication they distributed or proposed,” but rather “assert in conclusory language that subsections B and C of section 1056-B ‘are unconstitutionally vague as applied to most of Plaintiffs’ speech.’” Pet. App. 16a (quoting petitioners’ First Circuit brief).

In any event, the First Circuit’s holding is faithful to *Wisconsin Right to Life*, where the Court

The Maine superior court properly rejected the claims of the state-court petitioners on the merits and upheld the Commission’s decision not to withdraw its subpoenas, but erred to the extent it suggested that a donor’s actual subjective knowledge or belief is relevant to a determination under section 1056-B(2-A). The Commission will make that point clear to the Maine Supreme Judicial Court on the state-court petitioners’ appeal.

addressed an as-applied challenge to a provision in the Bipartisan Campaign Reform Act of 2002 that prohibited corporations from disseminating communications via broadcast media that targeted voters and named a candidate for federal elected office. 551 U.S. at 455-456. The Court held that the law was unconstitutional as applied to three radio and television advertisements. In so ruling, the Court held that “the proper standard for an as-applied challenge to [the statute] must be objective, focusing on the substance of the communication rather than amorphous considerations of intent and effect.” *Id.* at 469. As properly interpreted by the First Circuit, the BQC law is not unconstitutionally vague facially or as applied to petitioners under any of this Court’s precedents, including *Wisconsin Right to Life*, even assuming *arguendo* that the Court’s caution regarding the use of background facts may be imported from a challenge to a content restriction on speech to a vagueness challenge to a disclosure law.

2. Petitioners contend that the First Circuit decision conflicts with the Second and Fourth Circuits. Pet. 25 & n.25. The two Second Circuit cases on which petitioners rely involve statutes that are nothing like section 1056-B(2-A). Both *Federal Election Commission v. Central Long Island Tax Reform Immediately Committee*, 616 F.2d 45 (2d Cir. 1980), and *Federal Election Commission v. Survival Education Fund, Inc.*, involve various federal law issues under FECA, including the meaning of the phrase

This weekend was big.

From President Obama's speech at our National Dinner to final House passage of hate crimes to the National Equality March, **the nation's attention is on LGBT equality – we have a burst of momentum.**

Dear Matthew,

A deep and bitter disappointment from Maine yesterday: Maine voters have passed a devastating Proposition 8-style measure overturning the state's marriage equality law.

Our hearts are with everyone in Maine who fought so hard to win recognition for their families. The legislature passed marriage equality earlier this year, but a divisive anti-LGBT campaign to scare voters seems to have worked.

It is infuriating to see that the same fear-mongering ads that were used to pass Prop. 8 a year ago have triumphed again at the expense of so many. This is a terrible loss.

Although we lost our battle in Maine, we will not allow the lies and hate – the foundation on which our opponents built their campaign – to break our spirits. We are on the right side of history and we will continue this fight with even more vigor.

Our friends at No on 1/Protect Maine Equality waged a strong and smart campaign. Thousands of volunteers exposed hundreds of thousands of Mainers to the real lives of same-sex couples and their families – many for the first time.

I am angry. But more importantly, I am determined that with the anger I feel today from this outcome in Maine, we'll rise ever stronger to demand equal treatment under the law and equal respect for our relationships in Maine, California, New Jersey, and every state in the Union.

And in other state elections yesterday...

- **In Washington state**, voters appear to have cast their ballots to approve Referendum 71, a measure that would expand domestic partnerships to have every state-level right and benefit afforded to married couples. I feel confident that when all of the votes are counted, it will be clear that the voters of Washington chose to provide equal rights and benefits to same-sex couples and their families.
- **In New Jersey**, Governor Jon Corzine – endorsed by HRC – has lost his re-election bid. He has been a strong ally for LGBT people in New Jersey, and he had pledged repeatedly to sign a marriage equality bill that could still be passed by legislators later this year.
- **In Virginia**, HRC endorsed Creigh Deeds for governor and placed 20 staffers at work in key delegate races. Deeds unfortunately lost his bid for governor, but there will be new pro-equality voices in the House of Delegates next year.
- **In Kalamazoo, Michigan**, right-wing groups wanted to make sure it stayed legal to fire or refuse housing to someone just because they're LGBT. 65% of Kalamazoo voters disagreed and voted to approve Ordinance 1856, expanding the city's existing anti-discrimination law to include sexual orientation and gender identity.

Matthew, I know that the results of today's elections are frustrating.

But having seen the passion and dedication of volunteers in this election, I know that tomorrow is a new day – and that our movement has the strength and power it needs to keep moving forward.

Dear Matthew,

I'm sure you're feeling as disheartened as I am about the election in Maine. But if we crawl into a corner and lick our wounds, we're playing right into our opposition's hands. And today of all days, we can't afford to do that.

As we speak, the Senate is holding a hearing on the fully inclusive Employment Non-Discrimination Act (ENDA), and the House could hold its first important vote on ENDA in the coming weeks.

This bill would end a bitter injustice in our country: In 29 states, it's *legal* to fire someone because they're lesbian, gay, or bisexual; in 38 states, it's *legal* to fire someone for being transgender.

We need to make sure your representative's support stays strong – it's critical to passing this bill!

[We need our friends to remain strong as this fight heats up. Thank Rep. Joe Sestak for supporting workplace equality!](#)

This is one of the next big battles facing our movement. And it's going to be even tougher than passing the hate crimes bill was. **Right-wing groups loudly claim that measures like ENDA are grant "special rights" to LGBT people and take away the freedoms of people of faith.** It's absurd; it's wrong; we need lawmakers like Rep. Sestak standing up for what's right.

If there's one thing the hate crimes victory showed us, it's that Congress can move at a glacial pace. There's only one thing that speeds up the process: direct, sustained pressure from ordinary people like you.

Even with the most supportive Congress and president our movement has ever had, it's an uphill battle. And we won't have this Congress and this president forever.

So we can't afford to miss this window of opportunity. If we can pass an inclusive ENDA, we will make it safer for millions of people to live their lives openly in America – and the hearts and minds they'll change will open the door for "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" repeal and more.

We've waited too long for this moment. Let's make sure LGBT workers don't have to wait a minute longer.
