Nubble Pond is a small scenic pond located north of Panther Pond in Raymond. The pond has suitable water quality for brook trout and is managed for both warmwater and coldwater species. An abundant pickerel population provides a good fishery, but it also competes heavily with the brook trout. Stocking is necessary to provide a good fishery because there is no natural reproduction of brook trout in the pond.

The pond should be considered for reclamation in order to remove the competing species and permit more intensive management for the brook trout. Small trout ponds of this type are scarce in the southern Maine area.

Access is limited to walk-in over private property from the Plains Road. Public access would have to be secured before a reclamation project and intensive management could be initiated.
