Boundary Pond is located west of Dome Mountain near the Canadian border. The pond has no major inlets, but an outlet, Boundary Brook, flows southeast into the Moose River. The pond's shoreline is mostly undeveloped.

Water quality in Boundary Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Spawning and nursery habitat is limited, but a few brook trout survive to maintain a fishery. Growth is good with no other competing fish species present. The pond is not stocked.

Access to Boundary Pond is restricted by a private gated road reached from gravel logging roads in Quebec. It is open to fishing with use of live fish as bait being prohibited in the open water season. The pond is closed to ice fishing.
