Little Jim Pond is located northwest of Flagstaff Lake. The pond has no inlets, but an outlet flows west into Jim Pond Brook and eventually into Jim Pond. The pond's shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Little Jim Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Sites for natural reproduction are limited, so annual stockings of brook trout are necessary to provide for a fishery. Low numbers of lake trout exist in the pond, but contribute little to the fishery. Growth is good with only light competition from minnows.

Little Jim Pond is accessible via the King and Bartlett Road. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter months. See the lawbook for special regulations.
