Stratton Brook Pond is located south of the Bigelow Mountain range. The pond's main inlet enters from the east and its outlet, Stratton Brook, flows west into the southwest corner of Flagstaff Lake. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Stratton Brook Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish. The pond is shallow and water temperatures in the summer months reach critically high levels for coldwater fish species. The native brook trout population spawn in some of the tributaries to maintain a limited fishery.

Stratton Brook Pond is accessible via a gravel road east of Route 27. The pond is open under general law in the summer months and closed to ice fishing.
