

Principal fisheries: Largemouth bass, chain pickerel

Black Pond is an attractive little pond that provides some good fishing for largemouth bass. The lack of dissolved oxygen in the cool water, coupled with the large population of competing species, makes brook trout stocking unrealistic. An occasional wild brook trout is caught.

There is no vehicle access to Black Pond, but there is a foot trail that runs along the outlet stream.
