This stocking has established a largemouth bass population, but the fishery is not as good as expected.

Principal Fishery: Largemouth bass, Chain pickerel

Greeley Pond is a shallow weed blanketed body of water with good largemouth bass habitat. Bass were absent in Greeley Pond when it was first surveyed. After sufficient interest by local anglers to establish a bass fishery, the Department obtain 4350 fingerling bass from a Federal hatchery. This initial stocking apparently failed. In 1973, 48 adult bass were transferred from Johnson Pond, a pond known not to be affected with the bass tapeworm parasite.



