Shed Pond is a very shallow Pond providing habitat for warmwater fish species. The mud bottom supports abundant amounts of aquatic vegetation. Despite the small size of pickerel, they are the primary sportfish in the pond with the vast majority of the fishing occurring during the winter months.

There is no deeded public access to Shed Pond, but anglers have always been able to reach the pond over private lands. This continues to be easiest way to access the pond.



