

Tyler Pond is a small, picturesque body of water located a few miles north of Augusta. The pond's shoreline is completely undeveloped, affording anglers in central Maine a rare opportunity to enjoy their fishing trips in an undisturbed setting. Tyler Pond can be reached over unimproved roads located off the Summerhaven Road and the Old Belgrade Road.

Tyler Pond was reclaimed in the fall of 1989 to remove less desirable species which compete with brook trout for food and space. Annual stockings of fall fingerling brook trout will be made to maintain the fishery.

Special regulations are in effect at Tyler that are designed to enhance the size of trout available to anglers. These include a 12-inch minimum legal length limit, a 2 fish daily bag limit, and the use of artificial lures only.

Anglers can assist the Department in evaluating Tyler Pond's trout management program by recording the results of their fishing efforts in a diary or at the census box maintained at the launch site. Booklets suitable for maintaining a fishing diary can be obtained free of charge from the Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife in Augusta, Maine.
