Medomak Pond with its relatively shallow warm water should be managed for warmwater species. Smallmouth and largemouth bass provide for some good fishing.

No stocking of coldwater sport fish is recommended because of the heavy competition from the large population of warmwater fish.

A public boat landing is located on the west side of the pond along state road route 220 at the pond's outlet.
