
Junior Lake is a scenic, rather remote lake in the headwaters of the West Branch of the St. Croix River. To get there you must travel through thoroughfares by boat, either from West Grand Lake below or Bottle or Duck Lakes above. During low water periods be careful of rocks in these thoroughfares.

Junior Lake is capable of providing what is commonly known among fishery scientists as a "two-story" fishery. This means nothing more in this case than that the lake is capable of providing a fishery both for the large established assemblage of warmwater game species and one or more coldwater game species, in this case, salmon.

Salmon stocking will be required to maintain the fishery. Stocking of warmwater game fish is unnecessary.
