Suggested Management

Number Three Pond is a typical warmwater habitat well-suited to provide fishing for warmwater species. One small area near the southwest shore contains some cold water during the summer, but this water has a very low oxygen content and is not habitable by coldwater fishes. Occasional trout are caught near the mouth of the western tributary during the winter.


The white perch population of Number Three Pond could support a much heavier fishing pressure than exists at the present time.

No stocking is recommended.




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MAINE
