Clear or Mill Pond is located south of Rowe Pond. Two small inlets enter the north end of the pond. The outlet flows southeast into Wyman Lake. The pond's shoreline is mostly undeveloped.

Water quality for coldwater gamefish is good in Clear Pond. The main inlet provides brook trout with ample spawning and nursery habitat to naturally reproduce and create a fishery in the pond. Trout growth is good despite competition from minnow species. The pond is not stocked.

Clear Pond is accessible via the Rowe Pond Road. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and is closed to fishing in the winter. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
