

## Physical Characteristics

Area - 20 acres

Everett Pond is located south of Camera Ridge. The pond has no major inlets, but an outlet flows southeast into Butler Pond. The pond's shoreline is mostly undeveloped.

Water quality in Everett Pond is good for coldwater gamefish with cool, well-oxygenated water at all depths. A native population of brook trout provides a fishery despite a limited amount of spawning and nursery habitat. Although competition from other fish species is light, trout growth is surprisingly poor. The pond is not stocked.

Access to Everett Pond is restricted by a private gate on a gravel logging road. The pond is open to fly fishing only in summer months and closed to ice fishing. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
