Billings Pond is considered submarginal trout habitat. Water temperatures exceed 70°F during the summer months and springs are limited.

Yellow perch and suckers are very abundant in Billings Pond and further limit trout production by competition.

A few trout exist in spite of many limiting factors as a result of natural reproduction and migration.


Access to Billings Pond is via private gravel roads built and maintained by large landowners for forest management purposes.
