South Boundary Pond is located southwest of Northwest Pond. It has no major inlets, but an outlet flows northeast into Northwest Pond. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

A man-made dam on South Boundary Pond effectively raises the water level to provide suitable habitat for the native brook trout population. Water temperatures reach critical highs for trout in the summer months, but cool springs allow them to survive. Brook trout growth is slow, despite only minimal competition from blacknose dace. The pond is not stocked.

South Boundary Pond is inaccessible to the general public due to private gated roads. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and closed to winter fishing.
