

Principal Fishery: Brook trout

Chicken Mill Pond is situated adjacent to the old Route 1 in southern Hancock County. The pond was reclaimed in 1957, but other species have long since become re-established. Re-reclamation is not feasible.

The pond is stocked annually with fall fingerling brook trout. The fishery is mostly for age I+ 7 to 10 inch stocked trout along with some similar-sized wild trout. The inlet contains modest numbers of wild juvenile brook trout.
